### OL PEJETA CONSERVANCY BLACK RHINO SANCTUARY & HOME OF CHIPANZEE

OI Pejeta is the largest black rhino sanctuary in East Africa, and home to three of the world's last remaining northern white rhino. It is the only place in Kenya to see chimpanzees

#### Day 1 Sweetwater's Tented

Our guide driver will pick you from the hotel after breakfast, drive towards Nanyuki to the OI Pejeta Conservancy. Situated on the Equator and with a stunning backdrop of the majestic Mount Kenya, the 90,000 acre wildlife Conservancy boasts of an astounding variety of animals. We arrive in time for lunch then a short siesta. OI Pejeta is Home to the Big Five (the endangered black and White Rhinos, Elephants, Lion, Leopard & Cape Buffalo) and a host of other animals such as the Grevys Zebra, Cheetah, Gazelles, Black-back Jackals, Ostrich, Baboons, Waterbuck, Oryx, Eland and several hundred bird species, OI Pejeta's combination of these amazing wildlife and stunning views guarantees an unforgettable safari experience.

It also serves as a sanctuary for the non-indigenous chimpanzees and is the only place in Kenya to view these remarkably intelligent and endangered animals. Return to your tented camp for dinner and overnight.

#### Day 2 Nairobi

After breakfast drive south through the rich agricultural and hilly mosaic of small farms, coffee plantations and pineapple to Kenya's colourful capital city, upon arrival transfer to your city hotel or transfer to the Jomo Kenyatta International Airport for your onward flight.

## NAIROBI EXCURSIONS

**HALF DAY TOUR OF GIRAFFE CENTRE & KAREN BLIXEN**  
**DEP 1000hrs – 1200hrs**

Giraffe Centre is the headquarters for AFEW, the African Fund for Endangered Wildlife. Made famous by 'Daisy Rothschild', a giraffe calf rescued from Soi, on the border of Western Kenya, Giraffe Centre was established in 1983 as a sanctuary for the then endangered Rothschild giraffe. The breeding programme has been a great success and visitors can now watch these gentle giants at eye level from a raised platform. There is also the opportunity to learn more about giraffe at the interpretation centre and hand-feed them whilst watching the semi-tame family of warthogs snuffle around their hooves in search of tidbits.

Located in Karen, the beautiful Nairobi suburb which was once part of Karen Blixen's vast coffee estate, 'Mbogani' was Karen's home from 1917 until 1931. The house and grounds were made famous by the film 'Out of Africa' and have been restored by the Danish community of Kenya. Visitors have a glimpse of typical colonial life in Kenya at the turn of the twentieth century. As well as many of Karen's original belongings, replicas replace items which have been lost over the years. From the beautiful gardens there are magnificent views of the Ngong Hills, held dear by Karen and described so tenderly in her writings. At the front of the house the original millstone tables can be seen from which Karen conducted much of her farm business.

**HALF DAY VISIT TO DAVID SHELDRIK ANIMAL ORPHANAGE**  
**DEP 0900hrs**

Dame Daphne Sheldrick started the EIEphant and sometimes, rhino, orphanage in honour of her late husband David, the Warden of 6,000 square mile Tsavo National Park where they lived and raised orphans of every species at their home. The Orphanage is on the edge of Nairobi National Park where the youngsters feed in their mini herds with a mini Matriarch every day, coming back three times a day for their milk feeding and in hot weather, a mud bath. Visitors can see this at 1100 hrs possibly along with a few schoolchildren! There is a semi private encounter with them again at 1700 hrs when they come in for their bed time feed and sleep.

Each elephant sleeps with a ranger, who alternate between the 20-30 orphans found there at any time, to prevent the orphans becoming too attached to one person. All this is explained by a head keeper during the visit as are the harrowing stories of how many became orphans, mostly the result of poaching. They also explain what happened when the residents reach the age of three or four and graduate to the next stage, a release site in Tsavo. This is the most famous, the largest and most successful elephant Orphanage in Africa and even during a short visit you can see what wonderful personalities they are, and everyone is different. You can tell the difference between one who came from high altitude and one from low altitude.

**HALF DAY TOUR OF NAIROBI NATIONAL PARK**  
**DEP 0800 hrs – 1400hrs**

Unbelievably close to the human bustle of the city, this is an important wildlife reserve (Kenya's first, in fact), if only because it provides an opportunity to catch a first look at lions, leopards, buffaloes, and rhinos (no elephants, I'm afraid) during those precious hours before jetting back home or when first arriving or if only staying in Nairobi -- this is surely one of the easiest game drive opportunities on Earth. The reserve is also an important breeding center for the endangered black rhino and home to more than 100 different sorts of mammals, with as many as 400 species of birds recorded. Incorporating important migration corridors, animal concentrations are best during the dry season, which theoretically runs from January through March but is fairly unpredictable these days. In fact, if your flight into Kenya arrives by daylight, try to spot game during those final moments before touchdown. The park will give you a chance for close-quarters animal viewing.
